I regularly receive emails from the Heartland Conference of the United Church of Christ with information and opportunities offered by the conference. One such email caught my eye in recent months. The email was promoting the "Second Annual Pilgrimage to the U.S. Southern Border" and included in the pro-



motion were the words, "Come, see, be engaged, and surprised! Let the narrative of fear be replaced by relationships empowered with love."

As the situation on the U.S. southern border has been a topic of much debate, especially during the most recent presidential election, I immediately felt a pull to pursue more knowledge and understanding. I have since signed up to travel with several UCC colleagues on this pilgrimage which will take place January 13-19, 2025. Below is some of what the promotional materials say about the trip:

This pilgrimage into our southern "borderlands" will actively engage us with Indigenous peoples, Hispanic communities, multicultural communities of migrants seeking to enter our country, and other brown-skinned peoples already assimilated, working and thriving in the region. We know that when we come together sharing time, compassion, hope, and stories, the barriers that divide us are broken down and God's Spirit of understanding and extravagant hospitality is alive among us. Encountering strangers faceto-face, walking in solidarity with one another seeing 'in technicolored' reality, helps us to envision new ways to initiate God's "beloved community" throughout the world.

On this spiritual pilgrimage you will:

Have time to interact with and come to know people of God in the borderlands.

Be invited to think in new ways.

Catch visions of extraordinary grace.

Engage experiences that will take you beyond your imagination. Share excitement, compassion, the pain of injustice, and lament.

What I ask from each of you as I embark on what I'm sure will prove to be a very transformative and eye-opening experience are your daily prayers. Please keep me in your thoughts as I travel. And I will look forward to sharing much about what I learn with all of you on my return. And when I do so, I invite each of you to also, "come, see, be engaged, and surprised."



#### TRAVELING BY STARLIGHT

"They set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was." Matthew 2:9 (NRSV)



In the opening credits of the 1940 classic animated film Pinocchio, Jiminy Cricket sings the song that has become a Disney signature. The lyrics promise, "When you wish upon a star, makes no difference who you are, anything your heart de-

sires will come to you." If only it were that easy. We all know that wishing doesn't magically make things turn out alright, no matter how many stars we see. It doesn't matter whether it's the first star we see at night, or the brightest, whether it is falling or fixed firmly in place.

If wishing on stars brought about all our hearts' desires, there would be a lot fewer tears cried in the world. Likewise, if prayers were always granted in proportion to the fervor with which they are spoken, there would be much less pain and grief among God's people. But that isn't the way faith works. It isn't the way God works. God isn't a fairy godmother, ready to make all our dreams come true. God isn't a genie in a bottle, there to grant our wishes on demand. God isn't some heavenly Santa Claus, bringing us the things we want if we have been "good enough" this year.

And yet, every year at Epiphany we hear about the magi who saw the star and trusted in its promise of the coming Christ. But the hope of the magi was more than just wishing. They weren't expecting something to just happen to them. Instead, they understood that discovering the truth of the promise required a journey. The road that carried them from their homes far in the East to the place where they found the Christ-child could not have been an easy one. It would have been tiring, winding, arduous, long, and dangerous. They traveled by starlight, night after night, and when they came to their destination, they gave thanks for the Holy Presence, and continued traveling on yet another road, just as tiring, winding, arduous, long, and dangerous as the first.

Every year, we are called to trust to the same hope, knowing that when we find Christ by the light of the star, it does not mean that we have come to the end of our difficult journey, but rather that we will be assured that no matter where the road takes us, the Holy One walks with us, and we are not alone.

For the last few years, I have invited the people of Dublin Community Church to embrace the tradition of receiving a "Star Word." A Star Word is a word given as a point of spiritual focus—something to pray over, to meditate on, to wonder about, to inspire and guide us. They are simple words like "hope," "compassion," "awareness," or "gratitude." You might choose to let your word help guide you for a week, for a season, or for the year. Just as the magi of old followed the star that led to the Christ-child, we also might let these stars guide us on our spiritual journeys.

Star Words will be available in the narthex after worship on Sunday, January 5 and in the church office throughout the rest of the month. As you travel with your word, I invite you to be open to where it might lead you. I pray your star will guide you closer to Christ as the days unfold throughout 2025. May Christ's light shine ever brighter in and through you.

#### **WOMEN'S RETREAT 2025**

The women's retreat is scheduled for 2/28-3/2, 2025! Please plan to join us at a new location, Hope Wood Pines 2790 State Route 61, Marengo, OH 43334 <u>pines@hopewoodoutdoors.org</u>. This center is part of church camps through the Lutheran Church. Lisa and I visited this beautiful retreat center and are very excited for you to see it as well! It's only about 45 minutes from Dublin, so even closer than Templed Hills. Here are some details about the specific building we will be in:

Priebe Retreat Center sleeps 20 people in 10 rooms; each room has two twin beds. There is a shared restroom in each wing. Priebe has a kitchenette with coffee pot, refrigerator, sink, and microwave. The patio and picnic tables nestled among the trees is popular during summer and fall. The living room has soft seating; conference tables and chairs can be added to accommodate your meeting itinerary.

We will walk a short, level distance to the dining facility where we will have our 3 meals Saturday and breakfast on Sunday. We will likely take sandwiches to eat when we carpool and arrive there early Friday evening.

Total cost for the weekend, 2 nights, 4 meals and wonderful fellowship is \$128 per person. If this is a difficulty for anyone, please let me, Lisa or Becky know, and we will confidentially arrange for you to attend. We'd love to have a full cabin of 20 of us attending, so please make plans now and let me know that you can attend. Lisa and Becky will be providing some structured time for us and will let us know more about that as time gets closer.

#### Dublin Community Church Financial Summary – through November 30, 2024

**<u>Financial Update:</u>** Thank you for your generosity and ongoing support of <u>the</u> Dublin Community Church! <u>For the Month</u>

**Contributions** totaling \$42,750 were *favorable* to plan by \$5,839 or 116% of plan.

**Total Operating Revenue** totaling \$342,132 were *favorable* to plan by \$275,925 due to a transfer from Council Contingency Fund of \$281,312 for renovations.

**Total Operating Expenses** totaling \$53,227 were *unfavorable* to plan by \$27,417 or 66% of plan.

**Net cash flow** for the month was *unfavorable* to plan by total expenses exceeding total operating revenue by \$32,437.

#### <u>Year-to-date</u>

- Contributions of \$387,523 were unfavorable to plan by \$18,498 or 95% of plan
- Total Operating Revenue of \$1,003,843 was *favorable* to plan by \$473,566 or 189% of plan Total Operating Revenue includes a transfer of \$252,241 from the capital reserve for renovation of the Goodwill room and a transfer from Council Contingency Fund of \$281,312 for renovations.

• Total Operating Expense of \$ 1,112,335 was *unfavorable* to plan by **\$225,251** or **125%** of plan due to costs for renovations and final payment of mortgage

Total Operating Expenses included a payment to pay off the mortgage of \$188,464 as a transfer from capital reserves.

This quarter we initiated vocational and life skill activities in order to better prepare the young children for life after City of Child. Whether it is electric work with Santosh or sewing and cooking with Suvarna. The idea is for the children to be better equipped for everyday life.

#### **Deep Griha Academy**

Due to ongoing challenges with Government approvals, the numbers at school continue to suffer. We are making progress on the approvals and hope to have resolution in time for the next academic year. Through the challenges, DGA continues to focus on Sustainable Development Goal 4 (SDG 4) and aims to ensure that the school community has access to quality education and lifelong learning opportunities. DGA ensures their students have access to quality education, and through community outreach initiatives the teachers reach out to students from local schools, ones without the resources available to DGA, with language enrichment and computer classes. DGA also ensures that the teachers have access to continuous learning as they facilitate learning in the classrooms. This year DGA has organised Parental workshops in an effort to help parents support their child's growth and learning at home. DGA in effect is creating a space for learning, not just for the students but for everyone connected to the school.

Through corporate sponsorship the Science Lab was set up with interactive science models to engage students with activity to enhance learning. The teachers were trained on how to use the models in their classes.

#### **DEEP GRIHA Q3 Update continued**



DGA organised an Open Library Day where we opened up our library to schools in the area, parents, grandparents of the students, in a bid to encourage reading among all age groups. This event had 300 participants in person at school as well as online. It was fabulous to see grandparents reading with their grandchildren, adults and children enjoying stories together. Students from other schools in the vicinity had wonderful things to say about the event, they were thrilled to see the wide variety of books available and were surprised by the warm and respectful welcome at DGA. We made it to an online English news portal for this event, a first!

'Run to Learn' a mini run was organised to highlight SDG4, to encourage children to work their body as well as their mind. 92 participants from different schools, and institutes participated with support from traffic police, a hospital for an ambulance, and local vendors. The event succeeded in not just bringing the community together but also helping students appreciate a host of services in place to ensure their safety and ease as they move around in the world.



The India Hub of the GGU (Girl Gearing Up) Leadership Academy was led by Deep Griha and had girls from DGA, Aadhar Kendra Sponsorship Programme as well as an NGO from Mumbai represented. Another incredible experience for the young girls.

This Quarter saw the beginning of Applied Theatre sessions at school for Grades 4 and 5. The sessions seek to enhance: communications skills through expression, content improvisation for creativity, and to understand team work better.

DGA continues to strive for the holistic development of the children with access to academics, sports, music, theatre, dance, agriculture, vocational training and to create space to better understand their roles and responsibilities as part of society.

#### **Healthy Ageing**

The Senior Citizen Programme is focused on helping participants get their documentation in order to access various Government services. The ongoing activities have continued through the quarter, here is a snapshot of numbers reached:

- 1. Total elderly 4,366
- 2. Total Home visit 10,384
- Total Community Meetings 87
- Total attendees 1868
- Total OPD–60
- Total eye checkup camps 12

Apart from health services provided, we continue to ensure Dance and Movement therapy sessions continue, as do other recreational activities. In this quarter the ladies came together to celebrate the Nagpanchami festival with henna and some dancing together, always great for general well being of our Ajjis and Ajobas (Grandfathers and Grandmothers)
