ENDINGS AND BEGINNINGS

Life is full of endings and beginnings. We graduate from high school and go off to college. We move to a new town, change careers, marry, start families only to then one day send our own kids off to college. These endings and beginnings can often be exciting, but they can also at times be scary. Sometimes our lives



change unexpectedly, and we find ourselves having to "begin again" in ways we never anticipated – a loved one dies, we get a devastating diagnosis, a treasured job comes to an end.

If you were at the DCC Church Council meeting on January 21, or at our Annual Meeting on January 26, you heard it announced that there is a significant "ending and beginning" happening in my life in the coming months. I have officially announced my retirement, beginning July of 2026. The decision to end my call at DCC and begin my retirement has taken many months of prayerful thought and discernment. Serving Dublin Community Church has been one of the greatest joys and privileges of my life. But the timing feels right for this ending and beginning. And I look forward to still having 18 months to be with you. I pledge that I will continue to give you the absolute best I have to offer in these final months of my tenure. And I am confident that the future of Dublin Community Church is very bright.

Most of you know I lead the Sunday morning Seekers Bible Study class and have done so for more than a decade. Through the years we have done a variety of studies - everything from reading through the entire Bible, to studying particular books of the Bible, to looking closely at the assigned Lectionary Scripture each week. Facilitating the Seekers class has been one of my most rewarding activities over the years.

Last Fall, the Seekers class read and discussed a study on the book of Revelation – the final book, of course, in the Bible. It was challenging and eye-opening. And then as the class considered what we might want to study next, someone in the class suggested that since we had just studied the end of the Bible, perhaps we should go back and study the beginning. And so that is what we have done. We have just begun a study on the book of Genesis. The story of God's people as told in the Bible is one continuous story. And ultimately it is about God's love for God's people, throughout all their endings and beginnings.

And that is our story as well. May the Hoy Spirit hold you close in all your endings and beginnings.



Just as each individual within the church brings something special to the Body of Christ, each congregation has its own unique blend of gifts. So every congregation has particular gifts to bring to its community and to the wider church. Individuals have the responsibility to discern how their gifts might be used in service to others, and, in turn, each congregation has the responsibility to discern its unique, collective call in service to its own community and the world.

With Rev. Lisa's recently announced retirement in July of 2026, Dublin Community Church is entering into a season of discernment. It is our intention to use these eighteen months to their fullest, actively engaging in a process of discerning our congregation's particular call at this time in our life together.

Throughout these months, Rev. Lisa and I will facilitate an intentional, Spirit-led process to bring clarity to a number of questions—What are our gifts? Where does our story overlap with God's story through Scripture? What are our congregation's passions? What brings us joy? What needs in our community are unmet? What are our priorities in mission and ministry? What is our unique call in this moment? Where is it that our deep aladness and the world's deep hunger meet?

This sort of discernment takes time. And in order to be effective, it will take participation from many individuals. Beginning this spring, and continuing in the months that follow, we will hold a series of gatherings to engage in this important and holy work. More specific information will be coming in the weeks and months ahead. We need your gifts and your unique voice if we are to glean a more complete understanding of who we are as an expression of the Body of Christ and where God is calling us in the season ahead. I hope you'll join us!

Dublin Community Church Financial Summary – through December 31, 2024

<u>Financial Update:</u> Thank you for your generosity and ongoing support of <u>the</u> Dublin Community Church!

For the Month

Contributions totaling \$39,519 were favorable to plan by \$2,602 or 107% of plan.

Total Operating Revenue totaling \$48,545 were favorable to plan by \$342 or 101% of plan.

Total Operating Expenses totaling \$63,027 were favorable to plan by \$17,612 or 78% of plan.

Net cash flow for the month was unfavorable to plan by total expenses exceeding total operating revenue by \$14,482.

Year-to-date

- Contributions of \$427,040 were unfavorable to plan by \$15,898 or 96% of plan
- Total Operating Revenue of \$1,052,386 was favorable to plan by \$473,906 or 182% of plan
 Total Operating Revenue includes a transfer of \$252,241 from the capital reserve for renovation of
 the Goodwill room and a transfer from Council Contingency Fund of \$281,312 for
 renovations.
- Total Operating Expense of \$ 1,175,360 was unfavorable to plan by \$207,637 or 121% of plan due to
 costs for renovations and final payment of mortgage

Total Operating Expenses included a payment to pay off the mortgage of \$188,464 as a transfer from capital reserves.
