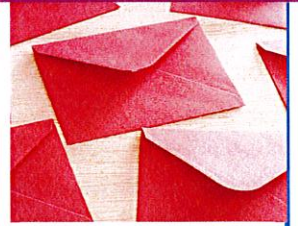
### CREATIVITY CIRCLE

### LIVING IN PRIDE



What does it mean to be proud? Is bad or good? Merriam-Webster includes several definitions of pride. One is “exaggerated self-esteem; conceit.” This definition is the reason why pride sometimes gets a bad rap and why scripture warns, “Pride goes before destruction and a haughty spirit before a fall” (Proverbs 16:18). This is the sort of pride that says, “I am better than you.” It fosters exclusionary thinking and creates divisions.

But not all forms of pride are bad. In fact, sometimes pride is very good. A second definition of the word denotes “pleasure that comes from some relationship, association, achievement, or possession that is seen as a source of honor, respect, etc.” We experience this sort of pride when we celebrate the accomplishments of those we love—our amazing confirmands and graduates, for instance. This sort of pride can also be found in scripture, like when Paul writes to the Corinthian church about their faith, saying, “I am being completely frank with you; I have great pride in you...” (2 Corinthians 7:4, NRSV).

Yet another definition names pride as “respect and appreciation for oneself and others as members of a group and especially a marginalized group; solidarity with a group based on a shared identity, history, and experience.” We can see this definition at work in expressions of national or cultural pride, like our upcoming 4<sup>th</sup> of July celebrations, or in the occasional Ukrainian dumpling workshops we host at the church, or in the great work from our friends at TASO. One might argue that this is the sort of pride scripture is highlighting when the church is reminded, “You are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God’s own people, in order that you may proclaim the excellence of [the one] who called you out of darkness into [God’s] marvelous light” (1 Peter 2:9, NRSV).

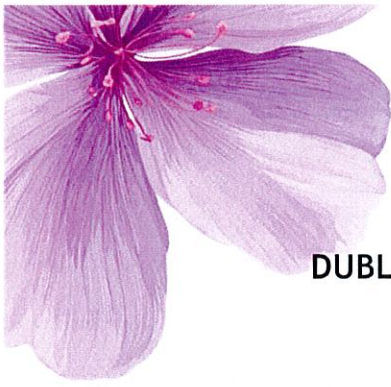
The first of these three definitions looks inward and isolates, recognizing only the perceived gifts within oneself, while the second and third look outward and create space to celebrate the gifts of God inherent in others.

It is the third definition that is on display in our upcoming recognition of Pride month and our participation in the Stonewall Columbus Pride Parade on Saturday, June 20. There is still room for you if you want to march with us in the parade downtown. Sign up in the church narthex or let us know. This is just one way we can live into our core value of celebrating the diversity of God’s creation. This is pride that lifts up and celebrates the identity and gifts of our LGBTQIA+ siblings and encourages each one to echo the proclamation of the psalmist—“I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are your works; that I know very well” (Psalm 139:14).

The apostle Paul wrote, “For what is our hope or joy or crown of boasting before our Lord Jesus at his coming? Is it not you? Yes, you are our glory and joy!” (1 Thessalonians 2:19-20, NRSV). I echo that sentiment. I am so proud to be your pastor.

## Finance Committee Report

### Dublin Community Church Financial Summary – through April 2026

**Summary:** Net cash flow is favorable for April and Year-To-Date. April is negligible but YTD favorability is driven by Revenue (not pledged donations).

**For the Month**

- **Contributions** of \$34,732 were *favorable* to plan by \$114 (100% of Plan).
- **Total Operating Revenue** of \$43,920 was *unfavorable* to plan by \$7,807 (85% of Plan). This is due to two months of preschool rent paid in April, so we're simply catching up.
- **Total Operating Expense** of \$43,046 was *favorable* to plan by \$8,683 (83% of Plan).
- **Net cash flow** for the month was *favorable* to plan by \$874.

**Year-to-date**

- **Contributions** of \$175,720 were *favorable* to plan by \$37,248 (127% of Plan) due to the recognition of pre-paid pledges in January.
- **Total Operating Revenue** of \$300,300 was *favorable* to plan by \$93,392 (145% of Plan).
- **Total Operating Expense** of \$191,781 was *favorable* to plan by \$14,771 (93% of Plan).
- **Net cash flow** year-to-date was *favorable* to plan by \$108,521.
