A Generation

Back in 2010, shortly after becoming an authorized licensed minister in the United Church of Christ, I had the privilege of performing my first baptism. The infant I baptized all those years ago is now an active teen at DCC, and I have since had the privilege of participating in his confirmation.



I decided at the time of my licensure back in 2010 that I would keep a record of every baptism, wedding, and funeral in which I took part. Some of those occasions were co-officiated by our former Senior Minister, Rev Bob Tussing, and some along with our current Associate Minister, Rev Becky Sunday. But for most of the weddings, and many of the funerals, in particular, I was on my own. And so, I kept a record of dates and names.

I am not going to bore you with “numbers,” although, as you can guess, I have many, many pages of dates and names as I have been serving DCC for 16 years, and I was a “Pastoral Intern” two years prior to that. What means much more to me than the “numbers,” however, are the names and faces and stories and memories connected with all the occasions in which I took part. To say that it is an honor to have been invited into some of the most sacred moments in a congregant’s life is truly an understatement. Words cannot express how much I treasure having had that privilege.

I was sharing recently with a ministry colleague that because I have been serving DCC close to two decades, I have had the distinct honor of watching young people literally grow up in the church. This summer I will officiate the wedding of a young woman who grew up at DCC and who went through Youth Group with my own children. As I was sharing all this with my colleague, she said, “You have served here for an entire generation.” Indeed, I had not thought of it in those terms, but it is true. I have had the privilege of watching an entire generation come of age. And in the midst of it all, in addition to blessing marriages and celebrating births, I have had the honor of sitting at bedsides and walking with families as they said goodbye to precious loved ones, or moved through other significant transitions in their lives. It has been an intimate and up-close view of the circle of life, and it has been one of the greatest honors of my life.

Thank you for the privilege of being invited into so many of your sacred moments. I will carry those moments in my heart, forever.

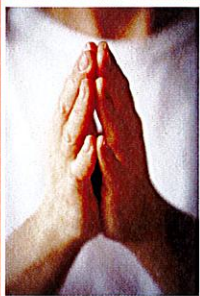
RUMMAGE TRIVIA?

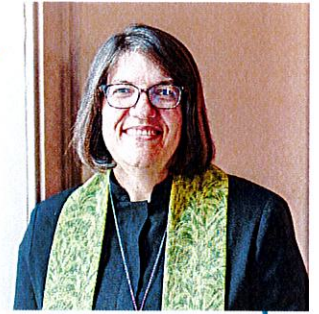

BREATH OF THE SPIRIT



In the coming weeks we will have two important celebrations marking the movement of the Holy Spirit in the life of Dublin Community Church. Perhaps the most obvious is the celebration of Pentecost. Marking fifty days after Easter, this year Pentecost falls on May 24. The story of Pentecost in Acts tells of the fulfillment of Jesus' promise that God would send the Holy Spirit to dwell with the people and to sustain them in their faith. The story tells how the Spirit came "like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house" (Acts 2:2, NRSV). The Greek word for "Spirit" (*pneuma*) can also be translated as "breath" or "wind." Likewise, the Hebrew word (*ruach*) has a similar meaning. On that first Pentecost, the Spirit brought with it not just the comfort of the presence of God, but it literally "breathed" new life into the disciples and brought about the beginning of the Christian Church as the message of Jesus began to spread.

The other celebration of the Holy Spirit in our midst will come one week before Pentecost as we celebrate our six confirmands on May 17. In Confirmation, we celebrate the gifts of the Spirit in our young people and recognize the ways God is moving in their lives, shaping them and all of us. As our youth become "adult" members of the church, Confirmation is a recognition of how the Holy Spirit is breathing new life into our midst. The confirmands' service project this year for *Stitched Together*, benefitting local kids in the foster care system shows how God is inspiring our youth to bring new ideas for us to expand the impact of our ministries.

There are lots of other ways I see the Holy Spirit breathing and moving in our midst. Have you seen the Gladden Chapel lately? It's amazing how the generosity of donors, the expert skills of specialized craftsmen, and some paint have breathed new life into our historic sacred space. I see the Holy Spirit moving in the development of our newly discerned core values. The Spirit is moving in Rev. Lisa's life as she comes closer to retirement, preparing her for the next great chapter in a life of faithful discipleship. And I trust that the Spirit is working in the pastoral transition process as our Associate Minister Search Committee continues its diligent work. God's Spirit is moving, and we are called to move with it, carefully discerning the ebbs and flows, rises and falls of God's breath and to do our best to match God's rhythm of life.

On the afternoon of Sunday, April 19, my eldest sibling, Beth, was installed as Pastor at First UCC Congregational in Marblehead, Ohio. During the installation service, my siblings and I sang two pieces we had grown up singing together, both of them part of the Medical Mission Sisters' album *Joy Is Like the Rain*. One of them, titled "Spirit of God" has a chorus that is a prayer imploring God's Spirit to "blow, blow, blow 'til I be but breath of the Spirit blowing in me." The sentiment is that if we allow God's Spirit to breathe within us, we become more and more attuned to God's life, and our own life begins to move to God's rhythms. The Spirit is alive here at DCC in so many ways. May we all continue to listen and discern God's movement among us and within us, so that the breath of the Spirit may continually bring newness and fullness of life.

From Rummage Comes Green

Dublin Community Church had not held a rummage sale in many years when in 2006 Lisa Bowersock, a then-member of the Mission Committee, suggested holding a sale. Proceeds would go to help boost our yearly Our Church's Wider Mission (OCWM) donations. This sale would provide a place where people could donate their items when cleaning out their closets, provide a service to the community, and keep reusable items out of the landfill. Money would go directly to OCWM and it would strengthen the sense of community among the members. Church council approved and in the fall of 2006 DCC-UCC held its first rummage sale. It made \$5,000.00. Lisa chaired this position until 2009 when Judy Martin took over.

Judy ran the rummage sale from 2009 until 2013. During her time she made the recommendation that a second (spring) rummage sale be held and all proceeds would go to youth group missions. This is when it became a bi-annual event. Janis Shannon and the late Annette Swanberg co-ran it in 2014.

In 2015 Donna Bond asked Betsy Smith to co-run the rummage sales. During their 8 years of dedication, they increased the revenue and organized it like a finely-tuned classroom because both were former educators. Betsy taught Kindergarten and Donna was a speech teacher. Due to the Pandemic there was no rummage sale in fall 2020 and spring 2021. In the fall of 2021 the rummage sale returned. They worked side by side until Donna passed away of cancer in December 2022. In the spring of 2023 Betsy knew she would need help and Kathy Blair stepped up to organize volunteer coordination.

In fall 2024 Green Team was added to rummage week to enhance the already "green event." The Re-Direct boxes were added to each department so unsaleable items could be placed there so Rebecca Shorter could decide if the unwanted items could be fixed and donated or recycled instead of automatically sent to the landfill. Composting and recycling stations were placed in the kitchen for lunch clean-up. With the increased focus on recycling, the recycling bin became full quicker so Ken Bitter offered to drive excess recycling to the SWACO bins at Carriage Place to save money on an additional recycling pick up at the church. After the Saturday sale Alice Wissman oversaw the breaking down of the boxes and hauling away the remaining recycling. In 2025 Green Team continued to divert "trash" to compost, Rumpke recycling, Hefty recycling, and donations to reduce the church's need for landfill space. In 2026 Morgan Fitzgerald joined the Green Team mission and will help with Re-Direct boxes, composting, and recycling during the rummage week while Alice Wissman will help with composting and recycling on the weekends. Rebecca Shorter will be in Charlotte, North Carolina attending a textile recycling convention.

Today is **Earth Day** all over our amazing planet we call home.

For the past 20 years Dublin Community Church-United Church of Christ has been preparing for its greenest bi-annual event, Rummage Week.

Our members have been diverting usable items from the landfill while raising funds to help others and in the meantime strengthening our fellowship.

Finance Committee Report

Dublin Community Church Financial Summary – through March 2026

Summary: Net cash flow is favorable for March and Year-To-Date. March favorability is driven by Revenue (not pledged donations), which more than offset unfavorability in Operating Expense. There was no new activity on Capital Project expenses in March.

For the Month

- Contributions of \$30,882 were *unfavorable* to plan by \$3,736 (89% of Plan).
- Total Operating Revenue of \$56,296 was *favorable* to plan by \$15,012 (136% of Plan).
- Total Operating Expense of \$57,335 was *unfavorable* to plan by \$5,606 (111% of Plan).
- Net cash flow for the month was *favorable* to plan by \$9,385.

Year-to-date (General Fund)

- Contributions of \$117,364 were *favorable* to plan by \$13,510 (113% of Plan) due to the recognition of pre-paid pledges in January.
- Total Operating Revenue of \$261,380 was *favorable* to plan by \$106,199 (168% of Plan).
- Total Operating Expense of \$148,738 was *favorable* to plan by \$6,448 (96% of Plan).
- Net cash flow year-to-date was *favorable* to plan by \$112,644.

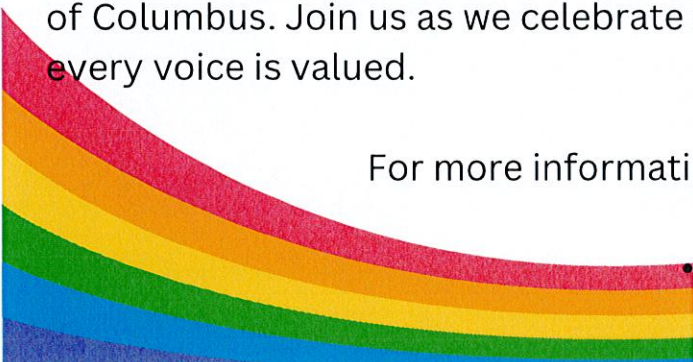

Confirmation Class Service Project

Each year the Confirmation Class chooses a service project that benefits a charity or group that they deem worthy of helping. This year’s Confirmation Class has selected to help a Non-Profit organization called Stitched Together.

Stitched Together is an organization that helps young people who have been placed in the Foster Care system. Many times, these children are forced to leave their homes with very little clothing, toiletries and belongings that are theirs. Additionally, these young people must carry their items in trash bags.

Stitched Together creates Hope Cases for three different age specific youth. They are for Premie/ Baby (newborn to 24 months, Kid (ages 2T to 12 years old) and Teen (ages 13-18 years old). There are different items that make up each of these age specific Hope Cases.

Once the Confirmands heard the story of youth close to their age that have had to enter Foster Care, they decided they wanted to help create Hope Cases that Stitched Together can provide for young people entering the Foster Care system. The Confirmation Class is graciously asking for the congregations to help in creating as many Hope Cases that they can for this worthy cause.

The Confirmation Class Service Project will begin on Sunday, May 10 with their kickoff announcement and will end Sunday, June 7. There will be a list of items that can be donated to this cause on the table in the Narthex. There will be a box in the Narthex that donations can be placed in. If you would rather provide a monetary donation, there will be a jar on the table in the Narthex. If wanting to pay via check, please make that out to Dublin Community Church United Church of Christ with Confirmation Service Project in the Memo line.

Once their collection period ends, the donated items will be used to create Hope Cases. Any monetary donations will be used to purchase any items needed or directly donated to Stitched Together.

The Confirmation Class thanks you for any help you can give, and they appreciate the generosity of this congregation.

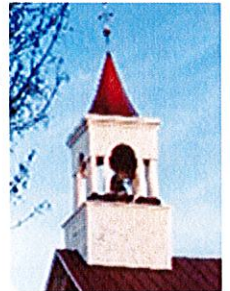
